BACKGROUND:

The 17th Judicial District Attorney's Office applied for and was awarded a new Federal Justice Assistance Grant (JAG) to serve all children and youth in Adams County needing substance use treatment through a community collaboration with iTHRIVE and Alternatives for Youth. Any child residing in Adams County is able to receive services through this grant.

The 2016/2017 Grant Award was \$70,774 from October 1, 2016 through September 30, 2017. There is a no cash match for the grant.
