## RESOLUTION APPROVING AMENDMENTS TO THE MARIJUANA REGULATIONS FOR UNINCORPORATED ADAMS COUNTY

WHEREAS, Article XVIII, Section 16 of the Colorado Constitution provides for the licensing and regulation of recreational marijuana establishments, including marijuana cultivation facilities, marijuana product manufacturing facilities, marijuana testing facilities, and retail marijuana stores; and,

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners (BoCC) has extensive authority to regulate land use within Adams County, including, but not limited to, laws relating to the County Planning and Building Codes, and the Local Government Land Use Control Enabling Act; and,

WHEREAS, on December 11, 2018, after careful consideration and evaluation of the County's marijuana regulations the Board of County Commissioners ("BoCC") revised and increased the maximum number of allowed marijuana establishments in Unincorporated Adams County from 10 to 12 establishments, adding two additional retail marijuana stores; and,

WHEREAS, at this time, the County wishes to incorporate these caps into the attached Marijuana Licensing Regulations as Section 3.02. for clarity and ease of administration; and,

WHEREAS, after careful consideration of the County's marijuana operation standards, the BoCC hereby revises section 5.02.04 to allow retail marijuana stores/medical marijuana centers (in the event medical marijuana operations are allowed in Unincorporated Adams County) to operate from 8:00am to 10:00pm to better align with neighboring jurisdictions.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Board of County Commissioners, County of Adams, State of Colorado, that these Marijuana Regulation Amendments, be approved and take effect immediately.
